Volkswagen Sustainability Council: Expert from China joins advisory body

- Yongtu Long, former Secretary-General of the Boao Forum for Asia and ex-Chief Negotiator for China's accession to the WTO, becomes tenth member of the Sustainability Council
- Third meeting of the advisory body of international experts in Wolfsburg
- Intensive exchange of information with the Volkswagen Group Board of Management on issues such as climate protection and sustainability management

Wolfsburg, September 28, 2017 – A further high-caliber expert has joined the international Sustainability Council founded by the Volkswagen Group. At its third meeting in Wolfsburg, Yongtu Long was appointed as a member of the Sustainability Council initiated by the Group Board of Management in the fall of 2016. Yongtu Long is one of China's leading political economists and diplomats, and has served in many posts, among them Chief Representative and Vice Minister of the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic

Cooperation in the negotiations for China's accession to the World Trade Organization.

They operate independently, are not bound by any directives and have far-reaching rights in respect of information, consultation and acting on their own initiative. For the funding of its own projects the Volkswagen Group is proactively making €20 million available to the Council for the first two years.
